
God said, "Look, I'm going to rain down food from heaven for you. Each day the people can go out and pick up as much food as they need for that day."



Look up Exodus 17:1-7 to read about how God gave the Israelites water in the desert. Then see if you can spot all 13 differences between the two pictures.


